Dear Dr Makis,

We had a consultation in August and I wanted to share my results with you and thank you for the help, I am sure I wouldn't have achieved these results without your protocol!. I am taking high dose ivm (2 mg/kg) and all the other things in the, I got 4 chemos and 4 immunotherapy sessions.

My tumor (HER2+, triple+ breast cancer with a lymph node met) was originally 3,5 cm. In September it was 2.5 cm (measured with ultrasound), and last week the doctor said it might have fully disappeared or around 1 cm might be still there, not sure. My Signatera test shows 0, and what surprised me is it was 0 in September as well!

My question is, do you think I should do the 2 chemos and immunotherapies left, or just continue with the repurposed meds? I also have 2 clips marking my tumor and the lymph node. Shall I leave them there or surgery is a better option? Should I get the lymph node taken out, or just the clip taken out from it?

This was one of my more aggressive protocols but 3 months later, and there's virtually nothing left of the cancer.

We still need confirmation with PET/CT but what a response!
