Hi William, hope you're doing fine!

My mom seems to be gradually seeing some improvements. She has been taking Ivermectin for 3 weeks and fenbendazole for 2 weeks.

She notices that there are small improvements every day, the pain is gradually decreasing (25 mg of fentanyl, enatyum and paracetamol, but sometimes she doesn't need so much paracetamol) and she is starting to get up and walk around the house with the help of the walker, as well as being able to sleep on her side, which she couldn't do before. So we are all very happy with these small improvements which mean a lot given its situation!

I wanted to ask you the following question....

She had a blood test and her hemoglobin was 7.0 (since his hemoglobin during his hospitalization was 8.2 and rose to 9.7 thanks to a blood transfusion). We wanted to know what we can do to raise that value?

I am attaching the blood tests she had done on 11/14 in Spanish.

Hi William, hope you and your family are well even all you're going through.

My mom is improving every day, she feels better, willing to do things, she can get up alone from bed and sofa, she is walking sometimes with the walker help and others alone some steps. We are very very happy with the improvements.

Today we received another blood test result and some values are showing good improvements, even with anemia. She is taking lactoferrin as you suggested.

Her oncologist was very surprised to see her well, with lucidity and with enough mobility (remember we're lying him about the treatment ; ) )

He recommended her, for the next visit in one month, ZOMETA (zoledronic acid). What do you think about this? Would you recommend the administration of this drug? Do you have any additional information we can read and/or investigate?

Thanks William! I wish you all the best at this moment, you and your family are going through a lot right now and you do not deserve that! The truth will be known soon! I always have you in my thoughts wishing you the best.



## STORY:

- 70s year old Stage 4 Breast Cancer patient with bone and brain metastases
  - Our protocol:
  - Ivermectin 1mg/kg/day
  - Fenbendazole 444mg/day 6 days a week
  - Lactoferrin 1000mg/day

Sometimes it's the quality of life improvements you can see right away:

1. "Pain gradually decreasing" (requiring less pain medications)
2. "Starting to get up and walk around the house" - Increased mobility
3. "being able to sleep on her side, which she couldn't do before"
4. "willing to do things"
5. "she can get up alone from bed and sofa"
